Welcome to our community from the Ewing Police Department, Community Relations Unit (CRU). This unit is comprised of Detectives who are responsible for addressing quality of life complaints, ensuring rental properties are maintained, and with being a direct liaison to TCNJ and Rider University administrations. Our goal in providing you with this information is to ensure that you have all the resources you need for a successful transition to becoming a resident of Ewing Township. Please take time to read and review this packet to have a better understanding of subjects such as trash and recycling pickup, Ewing Township Ordinances, New Jersey State Traffic Violations and New Jersey State Criminal Statutes. We have prepared this packet to assist all students living off campus with as much information as possible with the intent to keep our neighborhoods safe and clean.

The Ewing Police Department strives to be transparent and will enforce ALL state laws and local ordinances, including, but not limited to, underage drinking or possession of alcohol, noise, theft of street signs, improper parking and disorderly behavior. These offenses could carry a fine ranging from \$250.00 to \$2,000.00 and may also include community service, counseling, and disciplinary action from the associated school. If a police encounter takes place, always be truthful, respectful and forthcoming with information that may be requested by the officer. Also, we suggest tenants introduce themselves to their neighbors and possibly exchange phone numbers in case they are needed in the future. This is beneficial if there is a parking or noise concern. We have found that tenants who proactively engage their neighbors about social events and parking issues are less likely to be the subject of a complaint. As a reminder, most Ewing residents have lived here for many years, and while they do not mind the college atmosphere, they do expect their neighbors to be considerate of their properties and maintain cleanliness around their own homes.

The police department works in conjunction with Ewing Code Enforcement, which is responsible for matters relating to building and fire codes, along with property maintenance. As a tenant, you should have direct contact with your landlord or property management company to address any health or safety concerns within or on the property to ensure compliance with all state and local codes. As a tenant, if a landlord or management company is not complying or responding to your concerns, or you have questions about codes, contact Ewing Code Enforcement at (609) 883-2900 ext.7677. The Police Department and Code Enforcement work closely together and will assist tenants to resolve matters relating to safety and building codes with their landlord. If there are any other questions or concerns related to your experience in the community, please contact a member of the Community Response Unit at the below listed phone numbers and email addresses.

INTERACTING WITH OUR OFFICERS



When our officers initiate a stop or respond to a call for help or a citizen complaint, they are responsible for ensuring the safety of the public, protecting property, investigating the incident, and taking appropriate action, including enforcing local and state laws. All interactions are captured on the officer's Body Worn Cameras.

If you are the subject of an investigation, whether it is for an offense, ordinance violation or motor vehicle violation, your cooperation is essential and often is required by law and your school's student conduct policy. During their on-scene investigation our officers will request that you provide your identification. This is so they know who you are and, if necessary, who they would be issuing a summons or warning to within their discretion. They may also ask you which college you attend and any affiliations you have with organizations on campus.

The fact that you attend college or participate as a member of any college organization has no bearing on the actions our officers take. To prevent a single incident from becoming a recurring issue we require that our officers obtain this information, when it is applicable, so that our Community Relations Unit detectives can effectively review and respond to college-related complaints.

If you are issued a summons, you will have the opportunity to appear in court and have your case heard. Keep in mind that our officers are often asked in court to comment on the cooperation they received from the parties involved during an incident. Similarly, the Student Conduct Office at your school will likely consider your level of cooperation during any review they conduct.

The connection between Ewing Township and our local colleges is longstanding and our approach to ensuring all residents can enjoy this community is consistent. When you decided where you would live while attending school, you likely considered safety and quality of life much the same way your neighbors did when they chose to make their home here. The Ewing Police Department and our officers look forward to working with you to ensure those goals can be achieved.

COMMON ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS AND OFFENSES

Township Noise Ordinance



§ 408-4 Noise prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or use to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the Township. Such noise is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday; and the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., on the days of Friday and Saturday, in a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the building, structure or vehicle in which noise is emanating shall be prima face evidence of a violation of this section.

How does this apply to college rentals?


Very simply, if your sound system, television or guests can be heard from a distance of **50 feet from your residence**, and it is after the restricted hours, you and your roommates can be charged with a violation of the noise ordinance violation and face fines up to \$2000.00 for each violation.

How can you avoid this issue?

- Introduce yourself to your neighbors and consider exchanging phone numbers
- Keep your gatherings limited to a few friends
- Don't allow more than a few people to gather outside at a time
- Stagger guest arrival and departure times
- Don't post details of your gathering on social media

 It is better for you to report a situation that is out of your control than for your neighbors to have to call the police. Would you feel better about calling the police on your neighbors or calling the police yourself for assistance? Unwanted parties will be escorted from your residence and dispersed in a controlled manner.

Overcrowding



Your landlord is responsible for registering your residence with the Ewing Construction Office annually. Code Enforcement will then conduct a fire inspection and determine the appropriate occupancy load limit for each rental property. They will issue a certificate to your landlord when this process is complete, which **must** be posted conspicuously near the main entrance of the residence. Any violation related to the occupancy load can result in significant fines for you and your landlord. (State Fire Code - N.J.A.C. 5:70-3)

If the posted load limit for your residence is 12 and you allow 50 guests to be inside at one time the fire marshal can issue fines up \$2,000.00 per violation to you and your landlord. Not to mention the safety issues overcrowding presents in a residential home during a fire or other emergency situation.

Alcohol Possession

Article II Consumption in Public

[Adopted 11-24-1998 by Ord. No. 98-13 as Ch. 51, Art. II, of the 1998 Code]



§ 91-12 Public places and premises.

No person shall consume or possess in any open container any alcoholic beverage in or upon any public place, including but not limited to any public street, road, highway, alley, sidewalk, mall, shopping center, park, playground, parking facility, parking lot or in or on the premises of any public building.

No person, regardless of age, is permitted to consume or possess an open container in public in Ewing Township. If you are found in possession of an open container and are issued a summons you will face a fine of up to \$2,000.00.

Littering



§ 224-1 Prohibited acts.

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to place upon, deliver, deposit, drop upon, throw upon, leave or abandon within or upon any public or private property any garbage, cans, bottles, cartons and any other type of refuse whatsoever, or any handbills, advertisements, brochures, flyers, shoppers, samples or other unsolicited commercial matter, printed or otherwise, of every kind or nature whatsoever.

§ 224-3 Obstruction, nuisance and litter on sidewalks and other areas.

It shall be illegal for any person owning, occupying, leasing, managing or having responsibility over any lands within the Township to cause, permit or suffer any obstruction, nuisance or litter as defined in § 224-1 on any sidewalk, front, side or rear yard, alleyway or other area on said lands. Responsibility under this section shall extend to 18 inches into any abutting street.



Whether you are walking to campus or visiting one of our many restaurants be sure to keep Ewing beautiful by properly disposing of all trash. And if your guests leave trash on your lawn or the surrounding area take the time to clean it up. Homeowners and tenants are responsible for the cleanliness of their property and are subject to fines when issues like discarded drink containers go unaddressed.

Open Burning



§ 124-1 Open burning prohibited.

No person shall burn or permit to be burned papers or other matter on any public street or any other open area, public or private, located within the Township.

- Bonfires are not permitted in Ewing Township. All fires should be contained to a covered outdoor fireplace and should be always supervised by a responsible adult.

Public Urination

Article IV Urinating in Public

[Adopted 3-14-2006 by Ord. No. 06-11]

§ 257-11 Prohibited act.

No person shall urinate or place any bodily waste of humans on any public street, sidewalk or other place in public view, or to which the public is invited or has access, except in a lavatory toilet or similar facility.

DEFACING PUBLIC/PRIVATE PROPERTY

Occupying a Rooftop Prohibited

A roof is not a place to hang out or have a party, especially for people who are intoxicated.

§ 114-8 Use of rooftop; violations and penalties.

 Code / Ch 114: Building Construction / Ch 114 Art III: Property Maintenance Code



It shall be unlawful to inhabit or utilize any rooftop in a manner inconsistent with the 1998 International Property Maintenance Code, as adopted by the Township. Any person violating the provisions of this article shall be liable to the penalties set forth in Chapter 1, General Provisions,...

2C:17-3 – Criminal Mischief (Criminal Offense) and Related Offenses



Purposely, knowingly or recklessly damaging or tampering with the property of another is a criminal offense. Damages exceeding \$500.00 in value constitute a crime of the 4th degree which may result in you having to appear in Superior Court.

- Damaging mailboxes, business signs and other property falls under New Jersey's criminal statutes, and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law
- Penalties for these offenses include fines and monetary restitution, and may be reflected in your criminal history record

Township of Ewing, NJ / Part II: General Legislation / Peace and Good Order

Article II Defacement



DEFACE

To cover, mark, write on, paint, color or otherwise mar, disfigure or draw on any private or public property anything of any nature whatsoever without the express consent of the owner.

§ 257-4 Conduct prohibited.

- A. No person shall deface any private or public property.
- B. No person shall assist, counsel, aid, abet or knowingly supply materials therefor to any person in the defacement of any private or public property.

Graffiti falls under our local ordinance and the Criminal Mischief statute depending on the amount of damage caused.

2C:20-3 Theft and 2C:20-7 Receiving Stolen Property (Criminal Offenses)

Exercising unlawful control over property of another or taking another's property is a criminal offense.

- Taking a street sign or other property may constitute a **crime of the 4th degree**
 - Missing street signs affects emergency responder response times
 - Residents and your fellow students may be placed in unnecessary danger if they are unfamiliar with the area and there are no signs to help them determine where they are in an emergency



- If you are found in possession of a street sign you are subject to the same penalties as if you had stolen the sign yourself. **Stealing street signs is not a rite of passage and is not a joke in an emergency situation.**

Remedies For Repeat Offenders



§ 284-12 **Complaint.**

If in any twenty-four-month period a specified number, which shall not be less than two complaints, on separate occasions, of conduct upon or in proximity to any rental premises, and attributable to the acts or incitements of any of the tenants of those premises, have been substantiated by prosecution and conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction as a violation of any provision of Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes or any municipal ordinance governing disorderly conduct, the municipal governing body or any officer or employee of the municipality designated by the governing body for the purpose may institute proceedings to require the landlord of those premises to post a bond against the consequences of future incidents of the same character.

Often referred to as the “Animal House” ordinance, Ewing Township has given notice to landlords that they will be responsible for posting a bond up to \$5,000.00 for tenants who are convicted of a criminal offense or ordinance violation on two occasions within a 24 month time period to cover damages to others property, payment of fines and penalties and to compensate the Township for the cost of prosecuting these incidents. The ordinance also allows the landlord to recover the cost of any amount of the bond that is forfeited from the tenant.

What to do in an Emergency



Fear of criminal or disciplinary repercussion should never be a factor in your decision making in an emergency.

The law provides for immunity in many situations where a good faith effort is made to obtain medical treatment for people suffering from alcohol and/or drug overdoses

- If your friend or a guest is suffering from an overdose getting them the help they need quickly is the most important action you can take
 - Call 9-1-1 and stay with the patient until help arrives
 - If possible, have someone meet first responders to direct them to the patient



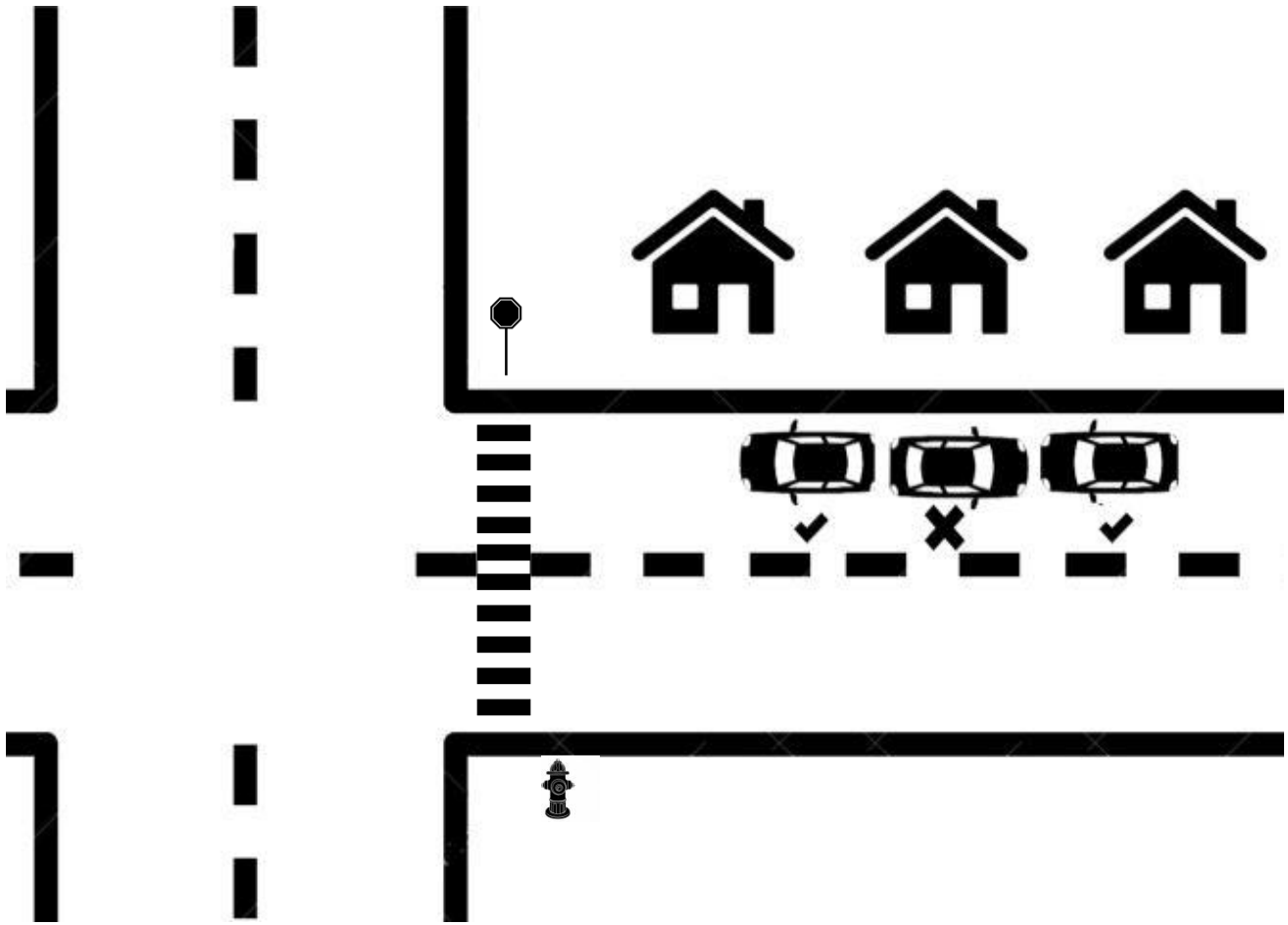
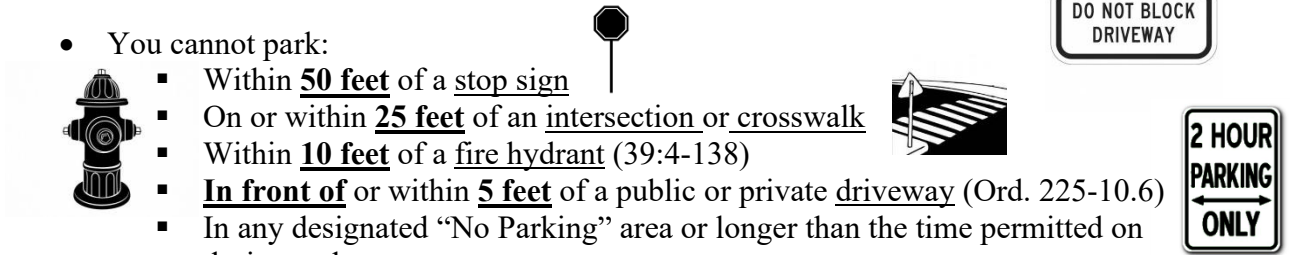
Make sure you are taking the time to familiarize yourself with the area around where you live and the places you visit. Knowing your location makes it easier to direct help where it is needed under the stress of an emergency.

Parking

Most rental properties have ample off-street parking available. If you or your guests do need to park on the street, keep the following restrictions in mind:

• You cannot park:

- Within **50 feet** of a stop sign
- On or within **25 feet** of an intersection or crosswalk
- Within **10 feet** of a fire hydrant (39:4-138)
- **In front of** or within **5 feet** of a public or private driveway (Ord. 225-10.6)
- In any designated “No Parking” area or longer than the time permitted on designated streets
- On any unpaved surface (lawns) – (Ord. 225-10.3)
- Further than 6 inches from a curb
- Facing against the flow of traffic

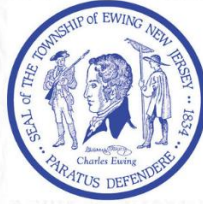

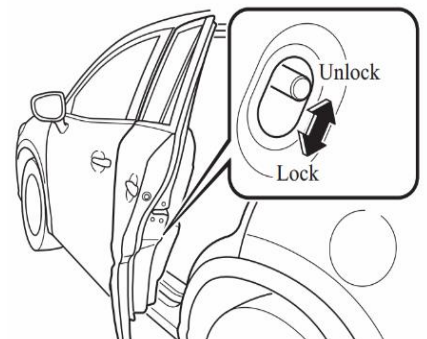

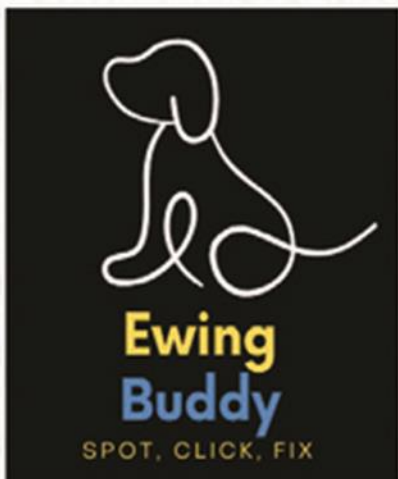

TRASH AND RECYCLING SERVICES

Many off-campus residences receive sanitation and recycling services through Ewing Township and its service agreements with Interstate Waste Services and the Mercer County Improvement Authority. It is important that you:



- Take note of your designated pick-up days
- Make sure you are storing your trash and recyclables in a covered receptacle
- Do not place your trash and recycling at the curb earlier than the evening before your scheduled pick up
- Bring your trash/recycling cans in from the curb as soon as possible after collection, and no later than 6 a.m. after your collection day.
- Take note of holidays and changes to your pickup schedule
